

Are you a Current Smoker? Will you help us?

This clinic is participating in a national study called Implementation of Smoking Cessation Services within National Cancer Institute (NCI) NCORP Community Sites with Organized Lung Cancer Screening Programs (OaSiS). The purpose of this study is to determine the best ways to implement smoking cessation services during lung cancer screening.

In this study, clinics that are part of the NCI Community Oncology Research Program are randomly assigned into two groups (similar to flipping a coin). One group of clinics will provide patients with their usual smoking cessation services that are already routinely offered for all smokers who are screened for lung cancer. Health care team members of the other group of clinics will receive special training on how best to implement smoking cessation services for patients undergoing lung cancer screening.

Your clinic is committed to finding the best methods to improve health and promote smoking cessation.

We are asking you to help us determine the best strategies for smoking cessation. What to expect:

- A member of the staff at this clinic will invite you to participate in a brief survey today while you wait for your lung cancer screening appointment. The survey will help us learn a little more about you, including your smoking history, your prior experience with quitting, and your interest in quitting in the future. The survey will take about 10-15 minutes.
- With your permission, we will also contact you by telephone within 14 days after your appointment today to discuss the care that you received to support smoking cessation during today's visit. We would also like to call you again 3 and 6 months after your visit today.
- All the information that you provide will be kept strictly confidential.

Whether or not you choose to participate in this survey, this clinic is committed to providing you with high quality care. You are under no obligation to participate, and your decision will have no impact on the care that you receive.
